### 2022 WAS A YEAR OF TRANSITION

Many of us returned to public places after months at home during the pandemic. For some, this was a welcome change. To be among people again was invigorating. For others, it brought stress. In particular, we learned that anxiety among children was tragically high. The other focus of the National Life Group Foundation, ending childhood hunger, was a bigger issue than ever due to inflation. That's when we stepped in to mobilize resources to help. In some cases, we broke records doing it.



Our employee donation matching program, Share the Good, raised almost \$750,000 for nonprofits our teammates care about. The majority of donations happened to go to the Vermont and North Texas Foodbanks.

For the third year, we partnered with Sodexo to provide Thanksgiving meals. This time we distributed 1,320, up from 1,100 in 2021. This was more than we ever packaged, more than we planned on. Our volunteers handed meals to those who needed one, no questions asked.

Our Do Good Cupboard, the emergency resource in downtown Montpelier that National Life stocks with nonperishable food and hygiene products, was often depleted the same day it was stocked.

In October, we held our first Do Good Fest at the Levitt Pavilion in Arlington, Texas. The concert benefited Parkland Health's Pediatric Behavioral Health Program and welcome LifeChanger of the Year grand prize winner Barbara Yarbrough to stage. The concert brought in more than \$50,000 for Parkland so they can continue to provide Dallas area children with the mental health resources they need.

Our Vermont-based Do Good Fest also did good, raising the most it ever has, \$86,000, for the UVM Central Vermont Medical Center's Branches of Hope Cancer Patient Fund. This fund provides resources including food, heating fuel, and more to those fighting cancer.

As for the general grants we give to nonprofits primarily in Vermont and Dallas, Texas, our focus continued to sharpen on ending childhood hunger and supporting children's mental health. \$1.3 million went to qualifying organizations to support the good they do in our communities. This focus allows us to maximize our impact on our core causes.

Finally, we ended the year by hosting a holiday event at Vogel Alcove, a childcare center for homeless children in Dallas, Texas. More than 60 National Life volunteers stepped in to help serve a hot holiday meal to families, children and the Vogel staff. There were balloon animals, visits with Santa and horse-drawn carriage rides. To see children playing tag and whispering in Santa's ear, as children should, filled all of us with hope. Because **when we work together, especially during times of uncertainty, we can do big things.**






Nearly one third was allocated to support children's mental health including \$35,000 to the Family Place and \$15,000 to Alliance for Children, both in North Texas.

# Extending the Good

With more than 40,000 National Life Group agents all over the United States, it's a natural extension to recognize the good they do in their own communities. We do this through the Agent Do Good Award.

#### **Affiliated Agencies**

**Robert Boswell** of Evolution Financial Group in Media, Pa., was runner-up for his work with **Tennis for Tea**l, which promotes ovarian cancer awareness and raises money for research at the Penn Ovarian Cancer Research Center. A donation of \$1,000 was made in Boswell's name through the Foundation.

**Tony Sardis** of Insurance & Investment Advisory Group in New Brunswick, NJ was also a runner-up for his commitment to **SNUGS (Special Needs Undergraduate Swim Lessons)**. The grand prize went to **Bill Le**, founder of Independent Agency Alliance in Houston for raising money to help to **combat poverty in his native Vietnam**. He raised more than \$150,000 on a mission trip in 2019 and returned again this year. National Life contributed \$7,500 in his honor.

**Mike Wilk**, a founder of Five Rings Financial in Littleton, Colo., was the runner-up, honored for the **Lee Nordine Academic Scholarship Program** named for a colleague who was a former teacher. A \$2,500 contribution was made in his name.
